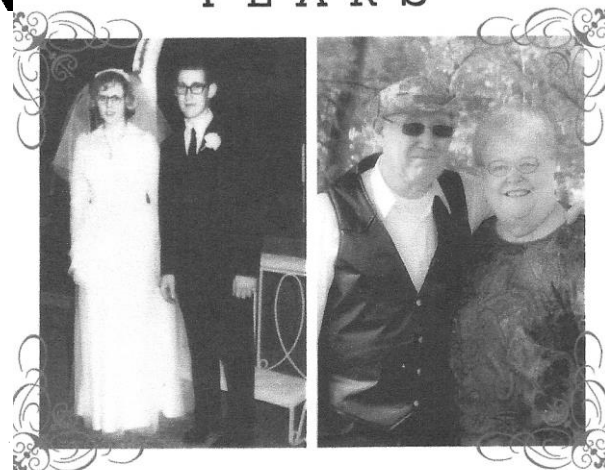

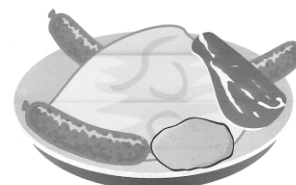

REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING CITY OF UDALL Monday, December 12, 2016

The Udall City Council met for the regular council meeting on Monday, December 12, 2016, at 6:30 p.m., at the city building. Mayor Brown called the meeting to order. Roll call was then taken with the following council members present: Lila Aimes, Michael Graham, Jason Tharp and Damon Wilson. Randall Smith was unable to attend. Quorum established. Attending were Maggie Schnoover, Eric Allen, and Lulita Hopkins.

GENERAL DISCUSSION:

1. Karen Deal, of Winfield, won the Splash Pad Quilt drawing which was held at the Santa Comes to Town event. The fundraiser generated \$467.00 for the Splash Pad fund.

CONSENT AGENDA:

MOTION: by Graham, second by Tharp, to approve the consent agenda and minutes of November 14, 2016, Regular meeting, Clerk's and Treasurer's Reports for November, Expenditure Report for 11-14-16 to 12-12-2016 of \$75,104.05 and Payroll Account Report Totals of \$19,929.66. All voted aye, motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS:

1. Employee evaluations have been performed and distributed to council members prior to the work session.
MOTION: by Graham, second by Wilson, to approve pay increases effective 1-13-2017 to Sara Barry, Tim Brooks, Mike Kennedy and Dennis White. All voted aye, motion carried.
2. Financing 2015 Street Sweeper Resolution #311
MOTION: by Wilson, second by Graham, to approve Resolution #311 financing the 2015 Street Sweeper. All voted aye, motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Doris Rubadeau has been recommended to appoint to the Udall Public Library Board.
MOTION: by Wilson, second by Graham, to appoint Doris Rubadeau to the Udall Public Library Board. All voted aye, motion carried.
2. A storage contained for the maintenance shop was discussed at the work session with prices and sizes reviewed.
MOTION: by Graham, second by Aimes, to approve the purchase of a storage container for behind the City Shop not to exceed \$3,100.00 including delivery. All vote aye, motion carried.
3. A voting delegate should be determined for the upcoming KPP meeting.
MOTION: by Wilson, second by Aimes, to appoint Michael Graham as the city's voting delegate to the Kansas Power Pool, with Damon Wilson as the alternate. All voted aye, motion carried.
4. Black and Veatch has contacted the city regarding significant modifications to their equipment and attachment to the water tower. This item will be tabled until the city attorney can review the contract.
5. Charter Ordinance #5 – Moving city council election from Spring to Fall with June 1, 2017 as the filing deadline for candidates.
MOTION: by Wilson, second by Graham, to approve Charter Ordinance #5 and its publication twice in the newspaper of record. All voted aye, motion carried.

Maggie Schnoover and Greg Crown arrived at the meeting.

6. Cereal Malt Beverages applications reviewed for approval – Felt's One Stop, Udall Groceries and Tacos and Salsa.
MOTION: by Wilson, second by Graham, to approve all three CMB applications as presented. All voted aye, motion carried.
MOTION: by Wilson, second by Tharp, to go into Executive Session for 30 minutes to discuss legal issues with right to call Ben Winters, Eric Allen, Maggie Schnoover, Erik King and Lulita Hopkins. All voted aye, motion carried.

Meeting resumed at the proper place and time, no action taken.

COUNCIL MEMBER REPORTS:

Wilson – Asked about use of the street sweeper. It has been used two days during the past week and picked up a lot of leaves. As discussed in the work session, it will be very beneficial to maintain the new pavement by removing debris.

STAFF REPORTS:

Schnoover – The new website has been successfully launched.

King – Presented purchase request at work session for two AR15's to adequately respond. Also presented requested for qualifying ammo rounds.

MOTION: by Wilson, second by Tharp, to approve the purchases as presented not to exceed \$2,000.00. All voted aye, motion carried.

MOTION: by Wilson, second by Graham, to approve the transfer of sick leave donated from two employees to another employee. All voted aye, motion carried.

MOTION: by Graham, second by Tharp, to approve payment of overtime to law enforcement personnel on recent incident. All voted aye, motion carried.

Allen – Presented purchase request for blade and install kit.

MOTION: by Wilson, second by Aimes, to approve purchase up to \$1,577 for blade and undercarriage installation kit with remote. All voted aye, motion carried.

Presented information on replacement of intake manifold on Ford F150. This can be purchased for \$500 with our crew doing the labor to install. After market versus market parts and repairs were discussed.

MOTION: by Wilson, second by Grahem, to approve parts purchase of up to \$700 on the '07 Ford F150. All voted aye, motion carried.

Two trucks and the street sweeper will be placed on Purplewave for sale.

Brown – Received a request for donation to After Prom, it has been the City's policy for the last several years to not donate to fundraisers. Ad renewal was received for the Cowley County publication.

MOTION: by Grahem, second by Aimes, to approve the ad renewal in the Cowley County publication at \$74.00. All voted aye, motion carried.

Approximately 80 children enjoyed Santa Comes to Town along with their parents and relatives. The city maintenance department did an outstanding job of designing and creating workshop and village decorations to add to the scenery. The decorations were all fantastic and many compliments were received.

MOTION: by Wilson, second by Aimes, to adjourn. All voted aye, motion carried. Lulita Hopkins, City Clerk

Deadline for story submissions is May 1, 2017.



Steak Fajitas with Cilantro and Olive Salsa

- 1 lb top sirloin, thinly sliced
- 1 Tbsp chili powder
- 1 tsp ground cumin
- ½ tsp salt, divided
- 1 ¼ cups chopped tomato
- 1 2 ½ oz. sliced olives, drained
- 1 green onion, finely chopped (about 2 Tbsp)
- 3 Tbsp chopped fresh cilantro
- Cooking spray
- 1 (16 oz) bag frozen pepper stir-fry, thawed
- 4 (10-inch) flour tortillas, warmed
- 1 cup nonfat sour cream

Combine steak, chili powder, cumin, and ¼ tsp salt; toss well. Set aside. Combine tomato, olives, green onion, cilantro, 2 Tbsp lime juice and remaining ¼ tsp salt; set aside. Heat a large nonstick skillet over medium-high heat until hot. Coat beef mixture lightly with cooking spray; toss well. Add beef mixture to skillet; cook, stirring constantly, 3 minutes or until browned. Remove beef mixture from skillet. Set aside; keep warm. Pat pepper stir-fry dry with paper towels; add to skillet. Cook over high heat 4 minutes or until lightly browned. Return beef mixture to skillet. Add remaining 1 Tbsp lime juice; stir well. Serve with tortillas, reserved cilantro and olive salsa and sour cream.
Yield 4 servings (serving size 1 tortilla, ½ cup beef mixture, about ½ cup salsa, and ¼ cup sour cream).
