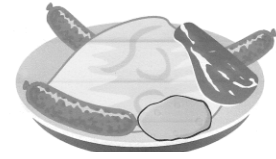

#### Caramel Apple Pie Tartlets

1 ¼ cups all-purpose flour  
½ tsp baking powder  
¼ tsp salt  
½ cup sugar  
¼ cup butter, softened  
1 tsp vanilla extract  
1 large egg  
Cooking spray  
1 ½ tsps. butter or margarine  
2 Cups peeled diced apple  
3 Tbsps fat-free caramel ice cream topping  
3 Tbsps sugar  
2 Tbsps all –purpose flour  
1/8 tsp salt  
½ tsp lemon juice  
½ tsp ground cinnamon

Preheat oven to 350°

Combine flour, baking powder, and salt in a small bowl; set aside. Beat sugar and butter at medium until light and fluffy. Add vanilla and egg; beat well. Add flour mixture; beat a low speed until well blended. Shape dough into a ball, wrap in plastic wrap; freeze 15 minutes. Divide dough into 16 equal portions. Gently press each dough portion into bottom and up sides of 16 (1 3/4 inch) miniature muffin cups coated with cooking spray; set aside. Melt butter in large skillet over medium-high heat; add apple. Cook apple, stirring frequently, over medium-high heat 2 minutes. Add caramel and remaining 5 ingredients; mix well. Spoon filling evenly into shells. Bake for 22 minutes. Let cool in pans on wire racks. Loosen tartlets from sides of pan; let cool completely on wire racks. YIELD: 16 servings (serving size: 1 tartlet.)

MOTION: by Wilson, second by Aimes, to approve agenda as presented. All voted aye, motion carried.

BUSINESS FROM THE FLOOR:

GENERAL DISCUSSION:

1. Mary Hilderbrand announced the Tom Wilson Fishing Tournament to be held on June 10<sup>th</sup> starting at 8:30 a.m. Fishing will conclude and prizes awarded at 10:30 am followed by the traditional lunch of hot dogs and chips. There will be four age groups and simple rules; 1. Don't fall in and 2. Be respectful to neighbors. Everyone is invited to bring out their young fisher persons.
2. Julie Wilson arrived at the meeting and thanked the council for sponsoring the night works display for the Fourth of July. She requested the council amend the ordinance to include sale and discharge of fireworks on June 30<sup>th</sup> also.

Schoonover – Collected survey information from council members, will prepare a report on findings.

King – May 22 – June 4 will be "Click-it or Ticket" dates for this Spring. Some interest has been expressed in possibly putting a building on the lots owned by the City downtown. This could be used for a fitness center. Erik requested permission to secure bids on various buildings appropriate for the use.
