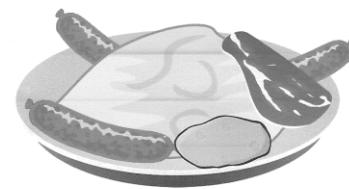

### Tortilla and Chicken Casserole

1 (28oz) can crushed tomatoes, undrained  
 1 medium onion, quartered  
 2 large garlic cloves, halved  
 1 (10 oz) can diced tomatoes and green chilies, undrained  
 2 teaspoons ground cumin  
 ½ tsp crushed red pepper  
 ½ cup fat-free milk  
 1 (16 oz) carton 50%-less-fat sour cream (such as Daisy)  
 Cooking spray  
 1 (10.11 oz) pkg ready-to-eat roasted chicken breast halves skinned, boned, and cut into bite-size pieces  
 2 cups (8 oz) shredded reduced-fat Monterey Jack

Preheat oven to 350°. Place tomatoes, onion, and garlic in a food processor or blender; process until onion is minced. Place tomato-onion mixture, diced tomatoes and green chilies, cumin, and crushed red pepper in a large nonstick skillet; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer, uncovered, 15 minutes. Reserve 1 cup tomato sauce to serve with baked casserole. Set remaining tomato sauce aside. Combine milk and sour cream in a bowl; stir with a whisk until blended. Arrange 18 tortilla halves in a 13x9 in. baking dish coated with cooking spray; top with half of chicken, half of tomato sauce, and half of sour cream mixture. Arrange remaining tortilla halves over sour cream mixture; top with remaining chicken, half of tomato sauce, and sour cream mixture. Sprinkle with cheese. Bake at 350° for 30 minutes or until cheese melts. Top each serving with about 1 tbsp reserved tomato sauce  
 Yield: 12 servings.

## REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING

CITY OF UDALL

Monday, July 10, 2017

The Udall City Council met for the regular council meeting on Monday, July 10, 2017, at 6:30 p.m., at the city building. Mayor Brown called the meeting to order. Roll call was then taken with the following council members present: Michael Graham, Randall Smith, Jason Tharp and Damon Wilson. Lila Aimes was absent. Quorum established. Attending were Greg Crown, Maggie Schoonover, Kerri Falletti, Erik King, Eric Allen, and Lulita Hopkins.

MODIFICATION OF AGENDA:

MOTION: by Smith, second by Wilson, to approve agenda as amended tabling Ordinance #671 to the next meeting. All voted aye, motion carried.

GENERAL DISCUSSION:

1. Kerri Falletti representing Cowley First, which is a county-wide economic development group equally funded by Arkansas City, City of Winfield and Cowley County. Their Advisory Committee works on program and projects bringing businesses and individuals to Cowley County. "Grow Rural Business" will be this Fall's project them. There will be WSU professors available to work with groups and Cowley Works workforce recruitment to encourage and attract workers to the area. Kerri also discussed programs working throughout the county such as this summer's Back Roads Diner program which has at this point distributed 1,000 punch cards to individuals who are to visit small cafes throughout the county in Atlanta, Burden, Rock and Udall.

CONSENT AGENDA:

MOTION: by Wilson, second by Graham, to approve the consent agenda and Clerks and Treasurer's Reports for June 2017, with correction(s) to the minutes of June 12, 2017, minutes of Special Meeting June 13, 2017, Expenditure Report of \$333,431.30, and Payroll Account Report Totals of \$17,768.75. All voted aye, motion carried with corrections to minutes.

OLD BUSINESS:

1. Sewer Rates – The anticipated report from KRWA on sewer rates was not received. Item tabled to next meeting.  
MOTION: by Wilson, second by Tharp, to table sewer rates discussion to the next meeting in August. All voted aye, motion carried.
2. Review USDA closing guidelines and time schedule, determine closing amount. The prepared time schedule for closing was presented to the council. There is an option of closing at \$1,000,000.00 and being reimbursed \$23,463 for expenses paid during construction.  
MOTION: by Wilson, second by Tharp, to approve the loan closing amount of \$1,000,000.00 and accepting reimbursement of \$23,463.00. Closing scheduled for September 14, 2017. All voted aye, motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. First Draft 2018 Budget – The council reviewed the first draft of the 2018 budget. Mayor Brown suggested to the council that next year the city should procure outside work on the budget either from the software company's consultant or another source.
2. Memorial bench for splash park in honor of Jerry Brown. The Mayor and Council wished to observe the passing of longtime Planning Commission member Jerry Brown. It has been suggested and approved by the Brown family for a bench to be purchased in memory of Jerry.  
MOTION: by Smith, second by Graham, to approve purchase of a 6' green bench in memory of Jerry Brown.  
All voted aye, motion carried.

COUNCIL MEMBER REPORTS:

Tharp – Questioned the finishing of the streets with such a pronounced crown. This has been discussed with Eric Allen and passed on to the construction crew. The demolition derby had a crowd of approximately 400 people, financial outcome undetermined at this time. It was organized by the Fall Festival committee as a fund raiser.

Wilson – Asked if the splash pad could be open until 9:00 p.m. Eric Allen will be advised.

STAFF REPORTS:

Schoonover – Requested missing surveys from council members.

Brown – Commented that the fireworks display was better than ever this year. He thanked the SUN Club for their efforts in organizing the show. MOTION: by Smith, second by Wilson, to adjourn. All voted aye, motion carried. Lulita Hopkins, City Clerk
