Grilled Maple-Glazed Chicken

- 2 bone-in chicken breasts
- 2 bone-in chicken thighs
- 2 bone-in chicken drumsticks
- 1 cup maple syrup
- 1/3 cup bourbon
- 1/3 cup orange juice

From Udall T.O.P.S. (Taking Off Pounds Sensibly) 6:30 pm each Thurs a Methodist Church. 305 S Church

- 2 tbsp. minced fresh sage
- 1 tsp. coarsely ground black pepper
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/8 tsp. ground red pepper
- 3 garlic cloves, crushed
- Cooking spray



- Combine all ingredients except cooking spray in a large zip-top plastic bag, and marinate in refrigerator at least 8 hours, turning bag occasionally.
- Remove chicken from bag, reserving marinade. Place marinade in saucepan. Bring to a boil; remove from heat. Coat grill rack with cooking oil; place chicken on rack over medium-hot coals (350*-400*). Grill 6-8 minutes on each side or until done, basting frequently with reserved marinade.

- 5. Carlton Smail reported that the firework show, flyover and ice cream social went very well. There was 176 servings of ice cream that were purchased and each piece got distributed to those joining the celebration

STAFF REPORTS: 1. Tim Brooks representing Maintenance for Eric Allen- a. Purchase total not to exceed \$1,259.97


