REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING CITY OF UDALL

Monday, June 8, 2020

The Udall City Council met for the Regular Council Meeting on Monday, June8, 2020, at 6:30 p.m., at the Udall City Building. Stephen R. Brown, Mayor, called the meeting to order. Council members present were Janette Adams, Ethan Exley, Matt McAllister, and Carlton Smail. Quorum established. Also present were Mitch Kratochvil, Eric Allen, Erik King and Lulita Hopkins.

BUSINESS FROM THE FLOOR: Mitch Kratochvil addressed the council concerning the April meeting. He said it was his property being referred to as having a fence in the easement of the neighboring property. He also complained about his neighbor's trees being removed. He said he talked with our surveyor and his fence was a foot and half off the property line. He was very upset about his treatment and took issue with the notifications sent regarding the final plat of the property. He was informed the city could find no application permit for the fence. Mr. Kratochvil exited the meeting. GENERAL DISCUSSION:

- 1. Expiration of Dog/Cat tags has been extended to July 1, 2020. There has been a greater inconvenience of obtaining vaccinations this Spring.
